# What is the CDBG-CV?



## Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act)

- HUD announced \$2 Billion for CDBG Grantees
- Entitlement Amount - \$358,320
- Substantial Amendment to FY 19 Annual Action Plan

# HUD Waivers for CDBG-CV Funds



- No Need to Update the Needs Analysis Sections in Consolidated Plan & Annual Action Plan
- 30 Day Public Comment Period has been Shortened to a Minimum 5 Days
- 15% Public Service Cap is Not a Requirement

# CDBG-CV Funding Availability



HUD CDBG-CV Entitlement	\$358,320
Planning & Administration (20%)	\$71,664
Amount for Allocation	\$286,656

# Eligible Activities Under CDBG-CV



## 1. Public Services

- Hotel/Motel Stays
- Emergency Rental/Mortgage/Utility Assistance
- Provide Testing, Diagnosis or Other Services at a Fixed or Mobile Location
- Provide Equipment, Supplies, and Materials Necessary to Carry-Out a Public Service

# Eligible Activities Under CDBG-CV



## Public Services Continued –

- Deliver Meals to Quarantined Individuals or Individuals that Need to Maintain Social Distancing
- Carry out Job Training to Expand Pool of Health Workers
- Increase the Capacity of Health Services for Infectious Disease Response within Existing Health Facilities

# Eligible Activities Under CDBG-CV



## 2. Public Facilities

- Construct a Facility for Testing, Diagnosis, or Treatment
- Rehab a Community Facility to Establish an Infectious Disease Treatment Clinic
- Acquire and Rehab, or Construct, a Group Living Facility for Patients Undergoing Treatment

# Eligible Activities Under CDBG-CV



## Public Facilities - Continued

- Rehab a Commercial Building or Closed School to Establish a Treatment Clinic (i.e. Replace HVAC)
- Acquire and Quickly Rehab a Motel/Hotel to Expand Capacity of Hospitals
- Make Interim Improvements to Private Properties to Enable an Individual to Remain Quarantined



# Eligible Activities Under CDBG-CV



## 3. Economic Development

- Provide Grants or Loans to Support New Businesses or Business Expansion to Create Jobs and Manufacture Medical Supplies
- Provide Short Term Working Capital to Small Businesses to Retain Low to Moderate Income Employees
- Provide Technical Assistance, Grants or Loans to Microenterprises that Provide Medical, Food Delivery, Cleaning and Other Services to Support Home Health & Quarantine



## 4. Code Enforcement

- Clean Up Homeless Encampments Once Individuals are Moved into the Motel

# Proposed Activities to Fund



- Emergency Rent/Mortgage/Utility Assistance
- Code Enforcement – Homeless Encampment Clean Up
- Loaves & Fishes – Extend Services Through the Weekends and Provide Funding for Supplies

# Proposed Activities to Fund



- Emergency Rent/Mortgage/Utility Assistance = \$200,000
- Average Assistance - \$2000/month up to 3 months = \$6,000 per Household
- Projected Number of Households to be Assisted = 33

# Proposed Activities to Fund



- Code Enforcement – Homeless Encampment Clean Up = \$50,000
- Average clean up cost = \$5,000
- Projected Number of Encampments to be cleaned = 10

# Proposed Activities to Fund



- Loaves & Fishes = \$36,656
- Extend Services Through the Weekends
- Provide Funding for Supplies
