The Contra Costa County Consortium, which includes the cities of Antioch, Concord, Pittsburg, Walnut Creek, and the County of Contra Costa (on behalf of all the other towns and cities in Contra Costa) receives federal HOME, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding every year. **During a five-year period, these funds will total over \$60 million!**

These federal funds, administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) can be used to build new affordable housing, improve infrastructure in lower income neighborhoods, provide employment assistance to small business owners, assist persons experiencing homelessness, and SO MUCH MORE!
