- 1. High School student poll worker program Contra Costa County: Presents an opportunity for the youth to participate in the election process and serve as poll worker volunteers. March 5th, 2024, as its rapidly approaching, volunteers are needed to be part of the team and assist on election day. High school students are able to expect community service hours, and resume experience. Will be asked to be excused from school by guardian in order to set up when it comes to election day. High School students who volunteer will receive a stipend of \$120 and to those who speak any other language additional to English receive 10\$ more.
- 2. Deena Sanchez field representative of the office of assembly member Timothy S. Grayson representing the 15th assembly district Assembly member Grayson has focused on issues relating to California housing and transportation services. Grayson has a long-proven history of advocating for victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, and child, and elder abuse.

- 1. The city applied for and received funding to run a basketball league on Friday evenings from March 15- May 17, 2024. Where the program provides lunch, and is welcoming to youth, administrators, teachers etc. A model UN is currently in the works for Pittsburg.
- 3. Measure X Opportunities: Community Advisor boards which are currently accepting applications for seats in the community. A great opportunity to share your ideas on where you believe where funding necessarily should be invested in. Commissioner Crose asked when the board members meet, which is once a month and meet in the evenings.
